## Summary: WP3-WS3

### Development of virtual-international curriculum

13-15 March 2017, Warsaw University of Technology, Poland

The last training session on development of virtual-international curriculum took place in Warsaw University of Technology, Poland. Representatives from all partner institutions participated in this meeting with the aim to finalize the development of the pilot sessions and to review and test the pilot activities.

**Mrs. Marta Szajnowska-Ksit**, Acting Director of the Centre for International Cooperation, welcomed the project partners and presented the overall international activity that takes place at the university to promote collaboration with universities around the globe.

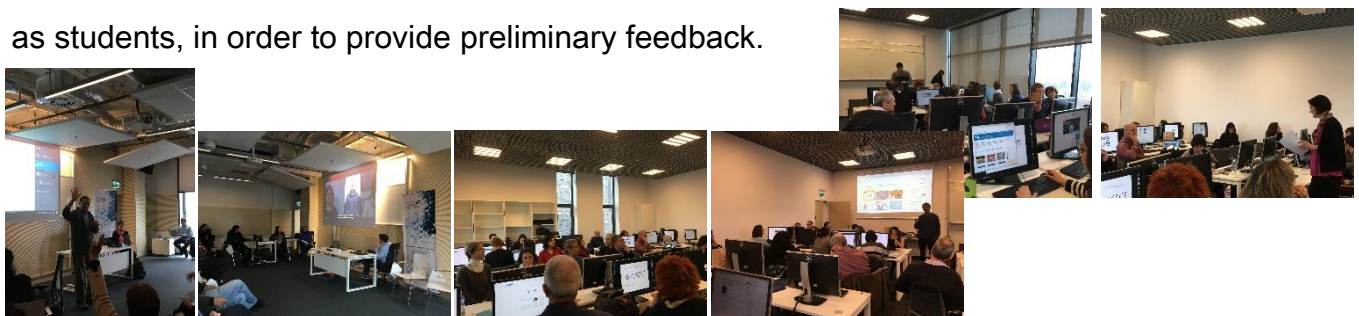


**Dr. Vered Holzmann** opened the meeting with a brief review of the latest updates on dissemination, sustainability and management tasks and issues.

The opening lecture was an online training session on the IN2IT Moodle technological platform, mentored by **Ms. Aya Elovits**, ICT Director in Sapir Academic College and her team. The training was moderated on-site with the help of **Shay Pinsker**. Shay explained the process of ticketing a new issue, while Aya presented the requirements collected from the partners' experience. She explained how to manage group activities, including establishing groups, engaging students to groups, etc.



The following sessions were based on "pilot the pilot", where each one of the four development teams presented their planned pilot activities and the project colleagues experienced the pilot as students, in order to provide preliminary feedback.







## Review: WP3- Pilot online-international courses May-June 2017, IN2IT LMS

Each one of the IN2IT international teams, composed of Israeli colleges and EU universities, conducted an online pilot of the online-international course. The content was developed by faculty members from the partner institutions and the delivery was facilitated by the technological platform, which was developed concurrently (under the scope of WP6). Following is a brief review of each one of the pilot activities. I would like to thank the team leaders for sharing their summaries with us.

**Essential Skills** pilot lasted three weeks and focused on the Essential skill of teamwork.

It included an introductory video, a "Getting to know each other" pre-task and two main Tasks. A BBB synchronic meeting followed each of the tasks. At the end of the pilot,



participants were presented with the subjects of the full course. The 36 students from seven different institutions (Brunel, Kingston, WUT, OBC, BBC, THC, SAP) enrolled in the course, while few of them dropped after registration and at the end of Task 1. The participants were divided into seven groups of 5-6 students. Each group included students from various institutions and countries. At this stage, each institution maintains focus groups and/or a survey to receive feedback from the students about the pilot. The comprehensive summary from all the institutional feedbacks will be used to build the full course.

The **Global Entrepreneurship** pilot included an introduction to entrepreneurship,



presentation of the challenge and ideas for solutions by the students, followed by a hackathon. 16 students from 5 institutions (KU, UM, SAP, BBC, and MTA) collaborated in 4

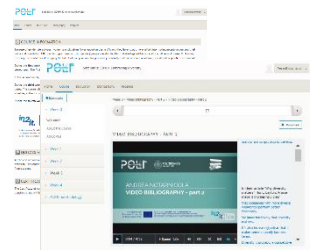
international teams to offer innovative ideas for "making cities inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable" (based on goal 11, taken from The UN sustainable goals, and specifically).

The students' feedback for the Hackathon format and cross cultural teams was very good though they were required to put in an intensive work assignment in just a few days. There



were some comments regarding the "dull look & feel of course on Moodle" and "vague instructions" so it was difficult to understand what goes next, assignments and dates. Further development will have to take into consideration these issues, as well as guidelines for building up the international teams of students.

The **Embracing Diversity** pilot is delivered on PoliMi MOOC and includes the part on gender diversity. More than 500 people from all over the world participated in this course and 119 of them have already completed the course (passing at least the 60% of the quizzes included). It includes 51 users of the IN2T pilot students from the partner institutions (KU, LUE, BBC, and KC). The course is based on four modules and at the end of each module, the student finds a self-evaluation quiz specifically created to help him/her check the status of learning progress.



The **English for internationalization Purposes (EIP)** pilot module was comprised of 3 online sessions and was originally scheduled to take place over a period of 3 weeks (a week per session). 25 students from 5 institutions (SAP, KC, WUT, QSM, and UCSC) were selected to participate in the pilot. Recruiting students was fairly easy, as most of them expressed interest and enthusiasm to join, the strongest incentive being the international group learning experience. Due to real-time difficulties in synchronizing schedules between the participating institutions, the pilot was stretched over a longer period of time and 22 students actually took part.



Teachers monitored their students' progress in the pilot, guiding and supporting them through the learning environment when needed.

According to student feedback collected so far, students felt relatively comfortable in the learning environment, saying it was friendly to use, and expressed their interest to take a complete EIP course. The EIP teachers are now in the process of drawing conclusions from the pilot experience and making the relevant adjustments to the development process of the entire course.

In the next two months, each one of the development teams will meet again to learn from the pilot and to make the required planning activities for the development and implementation of the completed courses next year. The lessons learned from this experience, recommendations and best practices will be summarized in reports that each development team will prepare and it will be used in the implementation phase during the third year of the project.



## Review: WP8- Dissemination

Following is a brief update on some of the dissemination efforts and deliverables that were achieved during the last few weeks.

The project pilot activities were published in the partner institutions in a variety of forms. For example, The Academic College of Tel Aviv Yaffo used Facebook to announce the opening of the pilot of Global Entrepreneurship and to wish their students good luck in this assignment.



**Certificates of accomplishment** were prepared for all the students who participated in the pilot activities upon completion of the pilot requirements. The certificates were awarded to the students in each institution to express our appreciation and as a means for additional marketing of IN2IT in the campus.



**IN2IT online-international courses pamphlets** for the next academic year were prepared in two versions: one of them is a general marketing brochure that presents all four IN2IT courses, and the other is a specific leaflet that is aimed to promote one course in more details. The partners received the templates of the pamphlets and will use them for distribution in class and publish on the university website.



On March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017, the IN2IT project was [presented to the members of VARAM](#) – the Board of Public Academic Colleges in Israel, which is an associate partner in IN2IT. 22 public academic colleges are partners in this board, and they are represented by the Presidents, Vice Presidents and the General Managers of the colleges. It was a great opportunity to present the project to the higher education community in Israel and to expose them to the project activities and deliverables.

On June 14<sup>th</sup>, 2017, the Israeli CHE conducted a [conference on Internationalizing Higher Education Institutions](#) for all Israeli HEIs. On behalf of IN2IT consortium, Dr. Vered Holzmann presented the topic of [Internationalization Strategy in](#)



[HEIs](#), explaining how IN2IT partners developed internationalization strategies and are now measuring the maturity of internationalization.

Further dissemination efforts will be made in parallel to the project core activities. In particular, IN2IT International Conference will take place in the University of Montpellier on 14-15 November, 2017, under the framework of the [DigiWeek 2017](#) (12-19 November, 2017). The theme of the conference is **Investing in Our Digital Future**. Thanks to **Dr. Francesca Casoni**, the IN2IT team submitted a proposal to participation in the conference and information about the project will be added to the conference webpage.

Please note that the [Digi World Summit](#) will follow the DigiWeek event, beginning on November 15, 2017, so interested partners will have the opportunity to participate. No fees will be needed from IN2IT partners for participation in DigiWorld Week. If someone wants to participate in the DigiWorld Summit, this event is not free but we probably will be able to get special rates.

The dissemination tasks are performed under the leadership of Tel Hai College, with a great support by **Ms. Mira Hershkowitz**.

The IN2IT COP is composed by two main parts: **International Teams** and **Community of Practice**.

The **International Teams** part (<https://in2it.vbulletin.net/community/international-teams>) is designed to support the collaboration among partners on the development of the international courses. In our opinion, now that the pilot courses have been realized, it would be worth to use this dedicated space to discuss on lessons learnt, results, feedback, future development and any other issues that can contribute to the process of creating the courses (not just the pilot) that will run for the next academic year.

The **Community of Practice** part (<https://in2it.vbulletin.net/in2it-community-of-practice>) is designed to support the collaboration of the partnership, but also researchers, teachers, administrative staff from Higher Education Institutions, and companies to share their experiences and needs to create new relations, joint projects and other collaboration opportunities.

In this area you can find 2 proposed path: **Community Tellers** and **Community Pathfinder**

In the first part, **Community Tellers**, you can share your experiences in internationalization in higher education, while in the second one, **Community Pathfinder**, you can discuss and propose your ideas and opportunities for international collaboration (i.e. grants, study visits, workshops, courses, international student exchange...).

As you probably remember, during the **WP4 Milan Meeting** (METID Polimi, 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Feb 2017) we have proposed to participants to work in small groups to identify possible collaboration areas on the basis of their common interests. Participants have used a **proposed document template** to organize and summarize the results of their discussions. Some groups have completed the template and we have proposed that each group upload this document in the COP area to continue the online collaboration to support the realization of the collaboration actions identified (i.e. grants, European calls, students exchanges, etc.). Unfortunately, at the moment there are not uploaded documents, but in our opinion, it could be worth to start from there to continue the

collaboration among institutions or, at least, to resume the discussion about it. Here is the link to the page of the COP where you can find this template:

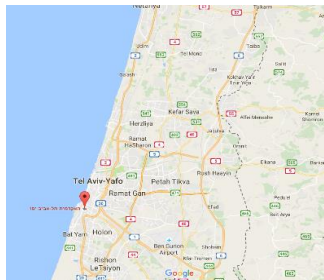
Representatives of all IN2IT Israeli partner institutions will take part in the meeting.
